About the Programme

Research has shown that the school holidays can be pressure points for some families. This can lead to children being less likely to access organised out-of-school activities and more likely to experience social isolation.

The government's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme is a response to this issue, with evidence showing that free holiday clubs can have a positive impact on children by providing easily accessible enrichment activities, whilst also providing them with a nutritious meal. The choice of activities is designed to develop participants' resilience, character, and wellbeing along with their wider educational attainment.

The HAF programme is delivered in Wiltshire using the brand FUEL (Food, Unity, Energy, Laugher) and the programme is a direct response to the growing issue of holiday hunger.

About the Role

We are looking for staff who are committed to making the school holidays an enriching experience for these children and are prepared to go the extra mile to achieve this.

The Assistant Camp Leader will be responsible for the smooth running of their assigned camp by supporting to manage between the 5-15 Camp Coaches who each lead a team of about 10 children (aged 4-16). With support from colleagues, including the Camp Leader and SEND Specialist, the Assistant Camp Leader will ensure the wellbeing of all participants by delivering a safe and engaging programme and will be in a position to step up to Camp Leader role if required.

This role is suitable for a youth leader who can act as a strong role model and support Camp Coaches in facilitating the activities.

Main Responsibilities

Attend compulsory training.

- Ensure that the support, pastoral, and safety needs of the children are met by supporting the Camp Leader in managing the Camp Coaches and taking part in daily check-ins.
- Ensure all policies and procedures are followed and tasks are completed accurately throughout the programme. Such tasks include incident/accident and safeguarding reporting as well as risk assessments.
- Ensure Camp Coaches are delivering assigned content in a fun and engaging way, ensuring that the children get the most out of each session.
- Work collaboratively with the Camp Leader to help camp coaches liaise with each other to coordinate resources and activity space.
- Manage your time well, supporting your own group or activity, whilst ensuring Camp Coaches are adhering to the timetable to allow any guest activity providers can deliver as planned.
- Work collaboratively with the SEND Specialist to best support participants who have additional needs.
- Run and facilitate sessions when and if required to support Camp Coaches.
- Adhere to staff code of conduct and wear your uniform when on camp.
- Be responsible and accountable for cleaning of classrooms/halls/venues etc, when it is a venue requirement to leave premises in state found.

- Experience of managing a team and working in line with a daily schedule.
- Experience of building a positive rapport with children from a variety of cultural, economic and social backgrounds.
- Ability to inspire and motivate teams and individuals to help them achieve their potential.

- Ability to be proactive and adaptable with the skills to think on your feet.
- Well organised with a responsible attitude to paperwork and recordkeeping.
